HIGHLIGHTS

The comparisons shown in this report are from Fall 2002 to Fall 2006.

University Level

- **Enrollment** – UTPA continues to grow at a fast pace showing a 20% increase in the past 5 years from 14,392 in Fall 2002 to 17,337 in Fall 2006 students.
- **Semester Credit Hours (SCH)** – Semester credit hours continue to increase at all degree levels with an overall increase of 25%.
- **Retention** – First-year retention has increased at the undergraduate level in the past 5 years from 64.7% to 72.7%.
- **Degrees Awarded** – The number of degrees awarded at the Bachelor's and Master's level continues to increase. The increase in percentage from 2002 to 2006 was 43% for Bachelor's degrees and 35% for Master's degrees. Attention needs to be paid to doctoral degrees awarded in order for UTPA to meet its goal of becoming classified as a Doctoral/Research University.

College Level

➤ College of Arts & Humanities

▪ Bachelor's

- **Enrollment** – The enrollment in the College of Arts and Humanities continues to increase. The only department of concern in the College is Philosophy, which had a decrease of 2% from Fall 2002 to Fall 2006.
- **SCH** – College of Arts and Humanities continues to have the highest SCH among the 6 colleges at UTPA. English department has the highest number of SCH, followed by History & Philosophy in the college. Communication department has the highest percentage increase in SCH (61%).
- **Retention** – Overall increase of 3.4%. The rates for History and Philosophy have decreased between Fall 2002 and Fall 2006.
- **Degrees Awarded** – Overall increase in degrees awarded except in the departments of Latin American Studies and Philosophy.

▪ Master's

- **Enrollment** – English and Modern Languages departments have the highest enrollment. Enrollment in English has increased by 125%. Art department has shown a decrease in the last 5 years from 21 students to 14 students (a 33% decrease).
- **SCH** – College of Arts and Humanities has the second largest percentage increase in SCH (from 829 to 1,244, a 50% increase). Most of the departments in this college continue to grow with Modern Languages seeing the largest percentage increase in SCH (85%). Art and Music are the only two departments with a decrease in SCH of 14% and 3% respectively.
- **Degrees Awarded** – The only department with a decrease in degrees awarded in the past 5 years is English.

➤ **College of Business Administration**

▪ **Bachelor's**

- **Enrollment** – There has been an overall increase in enrollment. Quantitative Methods/IS is the only department showing a continuous decline in enrollment in the past 5 years. The department of Management, Marketing and International Business has the highest enrollment. The department of Economics/Finance has shown the highest percentage increase in the past 5 years from 248 to 368 students (a 48% increase).
- **SCH** – Between Fall 2002 to Fall 2006 there has been an increase in SCH in all departments with Accounting and Business Law having the largest increase of 25%.
- **Retention** – Overall retention rate for the college has gone up by 6.4% in the last 5 years.
- **Degrees Awarded** – Overall increase of 38% in the number of degrees awarded.

▪ **Master's**

- **Enrollment** – Enrollment in the Master's program has increased from 193 in Fall 2002 to 257 in Fall 2006 (a 33% increase).
- **SCH** – COBA has shown the largest percentage increase in SCH at the Master's level in the last 5 years from 963 SCH to 1,467 SCH (a 52% increase). Among its departments, Accounting and Business Law has the largest percentage increase (193%). However, Economics and Finance has shown a slight decrease (-3%).
- **Degrees Awarded** – There is an overall decrease of 25% in degrees awarded in the past 5 years.

▪ **Doctoral**

- **Enrollment** – A 21% increase in enrollment from 43 students in Fall 2002 to 52 students in Fall 2006.
- **SCH** – Increase of 18% from 282 SCH in Fall 2002 to 333 SCH in Fall 2006.
- **Degrees Awarded** – The number of degrees awarded in this category is low.

➤ **College of Education**

▪ **Bachelor's**

- **Enrollment** – Overall enrollment has the least increase among the six colleges in the last 5 years from 2,509 students to 2,525 students (a 1% increase).
- **SCH** – There was a 9% decrease in total SCH. Educational Psychology shows a decrease of 66% from 873 SCH to 297 SCH.
- **Retention** – Increase of 11.2% over the last 5 years.
- **Degrees Awarded** – Overall increase of 16% in the degrees awarded. Interdisciplinary Studies has the highest number of degrees awarded in the college and the total has increased from 344 to 404 (a 17% increase) in the past five years.

- **Master's**
 - **Enrollment** – Starting Fall 2005 students are not being listed under Professional Improvement. Although Education department has the least increase (3%) among the six colleges, it has the largest master's student enrollment. The department of Health and Kinesiology shows the largest percentage increase in the College from 17 students in Fall 2002 to 35 students in Fall 2006 (a 106% increase).
 - **SCH** – A 23% increase in total SCH at the Master's level with a 14% decline in the areas of Cur. & Inst-Elem & Sec. SCH in the Department of Educational Leadership increased by 54% in the last 5 years.
 - **Degrees Awarded** – Overall increase of 32% over the last 5 years.
- **Doctoral**
 - **Enrollment** – A 70% increase from 30 students in Fall 2002 to 51 students in Fall 2006.
 - **SCH** – The SCH in Educational Leadership has grown from 162 SCH in 2002 to 233 in 2006 (a 44% increase).
 - **Degrees Awarded** – Overall 67% decrease from 6 in 2002 to 2 in 2006.

➤ **College of Health Sciences & Human Services**

- **Bachelor's**
 - **Enrollment** – The college of Health Sciences & Human Services has the largest enrollment increase of 35%. The highest enrollment is in the department of Nursing, followed by Communication Disorders. The Department of Rehabilitative Services has the largest percentage increase from 74 students in Fall 2002 to 267 students in Fall 2006 (a 261% increase). The Social Work and Physician Assistant Programs have shown a decline in the past 5 years of 12% and 46% respectively.
 - **SCH** – Communication Disorders has the highest SCH, followed by Nursing. Occupational Therapy has declined from 804 SCH in 2002 to 0 SCH in 2006 as the Occupational Therapy program has been phased out.
 - **Retention** – Overall increase of 9.3% over the last 5 years.
 - **Degrees Awarded** – Overall increase of 23% in the last 5 years.
- **Master's**
 - **Enrollment** – Overall increase in enrollment from 199 students in 2002 to 304 students in 2006 (a 53% increase) is the highest percentage increase at the Master's level. Greatest increase in enrollment has been in the departments of Occupational Therapy and Social Work.
 - **SCH** – Overall increase of 34%. Highest SCH is in the department of Social Work followed by Occupational Therapy.
 - **Degrees Awarded** – Overall increase of 76% with the greatest increase in the communication disorders program from 14 degrees awarded in 2002 to 47 degrees awarded in 2006.

➤ **College of Science & Engineering**

▪ **Bachelor's**

- **Enrollment** – Enrollment in Biology, Chemistry and Mechanical Engineering has been increasing steadily. Pre-Engineering is on the decline showing that more students in engineering have decided on their majors.
- **SCH** – Overall increase of 26%, but with 4% decrease in Computer Science department. Highest number of SCH is in Mathematics followed by Biology.
- **Retention** – Overall increase of 6.6% in the last 5 years.
- **Degrees Awarded** – Overall increase of 44% in the last 5 years.

▪ **Master's**

- **Enrollment** – Enrollment has gone up from 179 students in Fall 2002 to 244 students in Fall 2006.
- **SCH** – Highest number of SCH in Computer Science, but the largest percentage increases is in Mathematics and Biology (100% and 86% respectively).
- **Degrees Awarded** – Overall increase of 76% in the last 5 years.

➤ **College of Social & Behavioral Sciences**

▪ **Bachelor's**

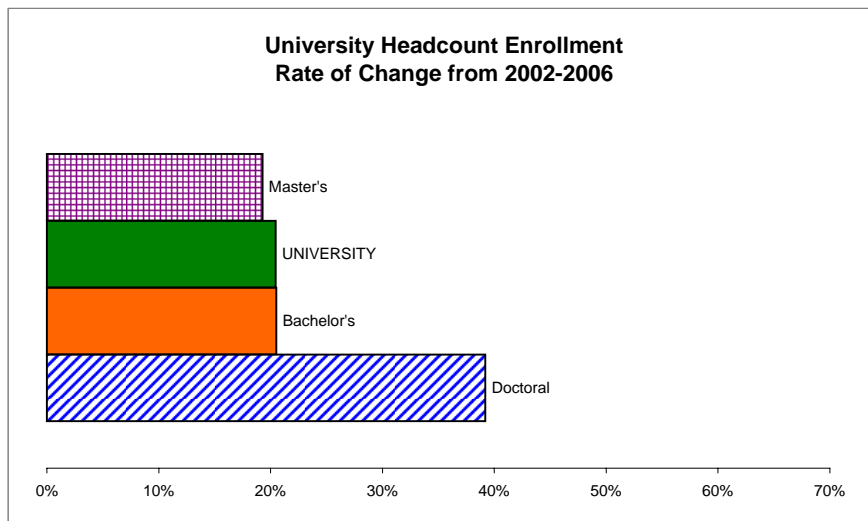
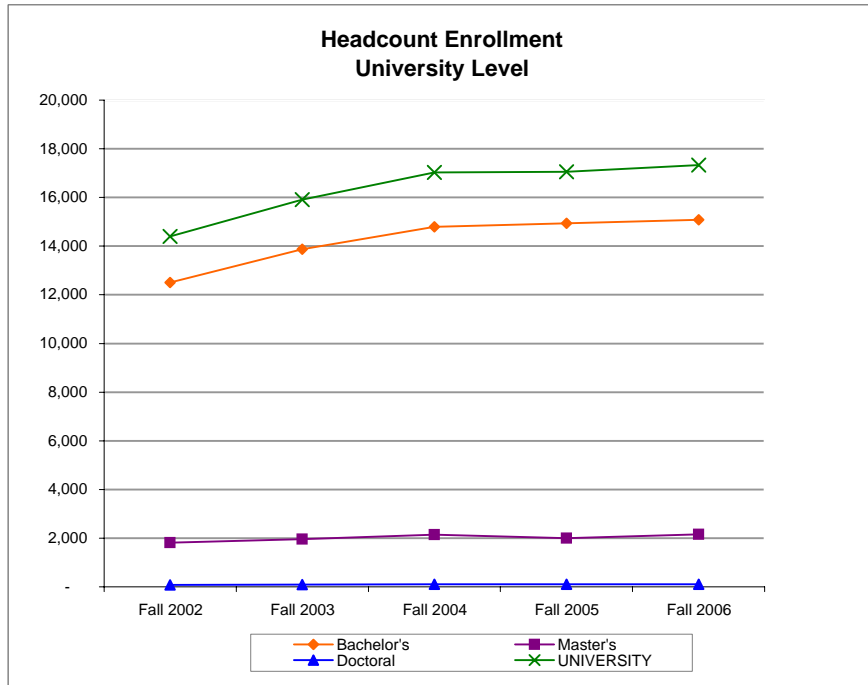
- **Enrollment** – Overall increase of 29% in the last 5 years. Interdisciplinary Studies, Criminal Justice and Psychology have increased by 240%, 80%, and 35% respectively. Highest enrollment is in Criminal Justice followed by Psychology.
- **SCH** – Overall increase by 41% from 18,123 to 25,551. Highest SCH in Psychology/Anthropology followed by Political Science. Criminal Justice has the largest percentage increase of 66%.
- **Retention** – Overall increase of 11.7% over the last 5 years.
- **Degrees Awarded** – Overall increase of 68% in the last 5 years. Anthropology shows a decline of 69% (13 to 4).

▪ **Master's**

- **Enrollment** – Overall enrollment has increased from 124 students in 2002 to 156 students in 2006 (a 26% increase) with Sociology showing the highest percentage increase (65%).
- **SCH** – A 34% overall increase in SCH from 777 in Fall 2002 to 1,038 in Fall 2006 with Sociology showing the largest percentage increase of 93%.
- **Degrees Awarded** – Overall increase of 106% in the last 5 years.

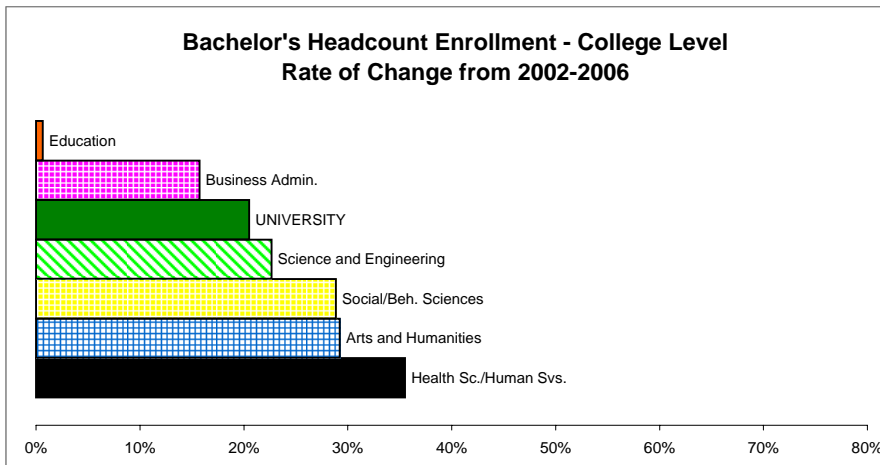
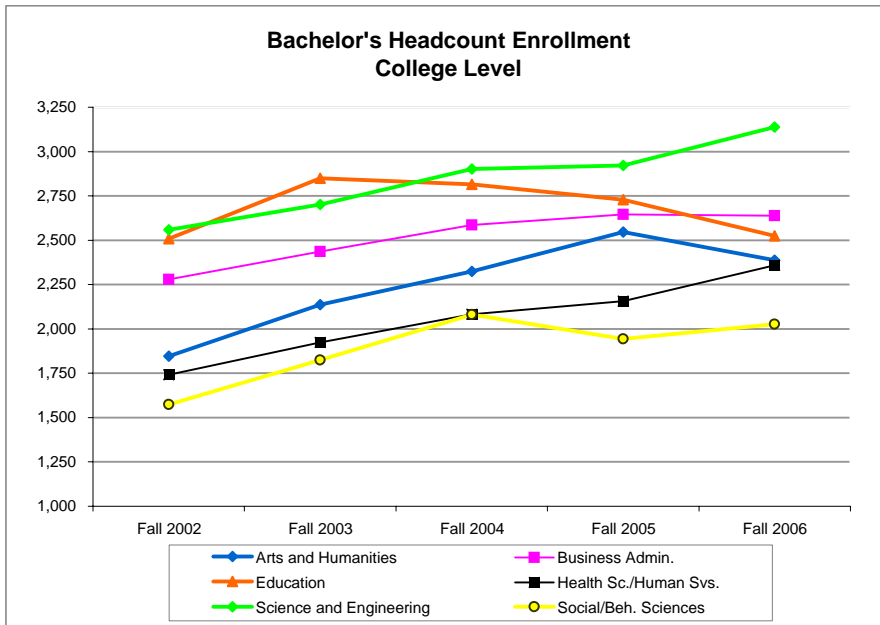
